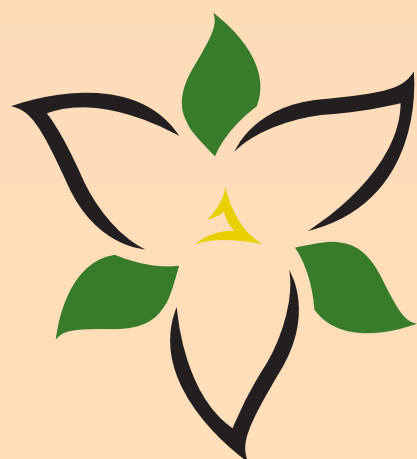

THE RULES

1. Persons entering this facility do so at their own risk.
2. It is strongly recommended that all users of this facility wear appropriate protective equipment.
3. Use caution when the facility is wet or leaf covered as the concrete surfaces will be slippery.
4. Do not sit on any part of the skate park. Please use benches for spectator seating.
5. No motorized vehicles permitted outside the parking area.
