BACKGROUND:

The Developer has requested a revision to the subdivision agreement to allow him to pay the required open ditch road section fee of \$57,148.50 in instalments. The fee would be divided into 18 separate payments to be paid prior to the issuance of each building permit. If the subdivision is proposed to be assumed by the Township, the balance would be payable prior to assumption.

RECOMMENDATION:
